

## HEBREW LANGUAGE

The students will:

- Introduce themselves orally and in writing.
- Converse about everyday topics.
- Converse about, write about, and express opinions on topics relevant to youth.
- Listen to, understand, and respond to Hebrew speakers conversing on various topics.
- Listen to songs and discuss their central themes.
- Interview and be interviewed orally and in writing on various topics.
- Listen to short lectures, read short non-fiction texts, and write parallel texts on topics of general world knowledge, Judaism, Israel, and the world of youth in Israel and outside of Israel.
- Watch videos about and understand diverse Israeli children.
- Read and write notes on every day topics, short letters, birthday cards, etc.
- Listen to and read a short, adapted folk-tale and write a parallel folk tale.
- Read a short poem or rabbinic *midrash* and discuss its content and central message in modern Hebrew.
- Use correctly, fluently, and naturally, simple nominal and verbal clauses and sentences with such common coordinating conjunctions.
- Master use of agreement of subject and object and of adjective and noun.
- Conjugate and use correctly, fluently, and naturally the present tense and the infinitive of verbs.
- Identify the prefixes and suffixes of the past and future tense in all regular verb patterns.
